LOCAL ELECTION INFORMATION

On November 8, 2016, Stanton voters will vote for candidates for two City Council seats and two local measures: Measure QQ to repeal existing voter-approved funding for City services and Measure RR, a City Council term limits measure.

If enacted, Measure QQ, also known as the Eliminate Funding for Stanton 9-1-1 Public Safety and Essential City Services Protection Measure, would repeal funding previously approved by voters in 2014.

Measure RR, also known as the Stanton City Council Term Limits Measure, would limit Stanton City Council Members to no more than two (2) full terms.

The **November 8, 2016** ballot is expected to be one of the longest ballots in recent history, and Stanton's local measures will be placed at the end of the ballot. Absentee ballots will begin going out the week of **October 10, 2016**. Vote-by-mail ballots must be postmarked on or before November 8, 2016. Election Day is November 8, 2016. Polling locations are open between 7 a.m. and 8 p.m. If you do not know where your polling place is, visit www.ocvote.com/registration/verify-your-voter-registration.

KEEPING YOU INFORMED

Water Conservation Update

As a result of your extraordinary efforts to help conserve water during one of the worst droughts, the local conservation target has been reduced to 9%, compared to 16% in previous years. City of Stanton residents can now water outdoor landscapes up to three days per week. To ensure continued efficient water use, please follow irrigation guidelines from the Golden State Water Company:



Outdoor Irrigation Days

Even addresses (0, 2, 4, 6, 8): Wednesday, Friday and Sunday

Odd addresses (1, 3, 5, 7, 9): Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday

Irrigation must occur before 8 a.m. or after 7 p.m. and should not exceed 10 minutes per station.

Prohibited Uses of Water

- Hosing off sidewalks, driveways and other hardscapes.
- Operating a fountain or decorative water feature, unless water is part of a recirculation system.
- Washing a vehicle with a hose not fitted with a shut-off nozzle.
- Watering landscapes in a manner that causes excess runoff or 48 hours after precipitation.

New Animal Care Services for City of Stanton- Effective November 1, 2016

The City of Stanton is pleased to announce its new Animal Care and Shelter Services Agreement with the City of Westminster and the Westminster Adoption Group and Services (WAGS), effective November 1, 2016. For over two decades the City of Stanton received excellent animal care and shelter services from the County of Orange. The decision to pursue a new provider was motivated by the County's announcement to build a new shelter and move its services to the City of Tustin; costing the City over \$600,000 during the next ten years and obligating Stanton residents to handle animal care services in Tustin.

The City's new agreement with the Westminster Police Department Animal Control Unit and WAGS will immediately save Stanton and its residents an estimated \$82,000 per year, without jeopardizing essential animal care services. City of Stanton residents will now benefit from the same valuable services The Westminster Police Department Animal Control Unit and WAGS offers to residents including:

- 25 hours of dedicated patrol weekly in the City by Westminster Animal Control Officers and responding to calls.
- Routine animal control patrols to help ensure safety and peace of mind for residents
- Annual neighborhood canvassing
- Dead animal pick-up (not offered with the City's previous contract)
- On-call services
- Pet and facility licensing
- Shelter services
- Veterinary services six days a week
- Trap neuter release/feral cat program

When the City was searching for new providers, Stanton City Council took cost, overall service, and convenience into consideration. City Council wanted Stanton residents to enjoy easy access to animal care related services while saving taxpayer money. ORANGE COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT

Update on Stanton's Public Safety



Over the past year, the City of Stanton made public safety a top priority for our community. Thanks to voter-enacted funding, the City has been able to restore positions cut during the Recession, including adding two sheriff's deputies to the force protecting Stanton, increasing neighborhood police patrols and keeping Stanton's 9-1-1 emergency response times low. In addition, the City has been able to hire an additional code enforcement officer, focusing on cleaning up gang tagging, graffiti, and other quality of life issues.



The responsibilities of Stanton's police force have continued to increase. In the past year, our sheriffs have received nearly 20,000 calls for service. That's an average of 53 calls each day. Stanton sheriffs average three arrests per day, with a total of 143 gang arrests – a 10% increase over 2014. With 11 active gangs currently operating in the City, our sheriffs are committed to providing rapid 9-1-1 response and gang and youth violence prevention and intervention programs.

To further strengthen the City's commitment to safety, Stanton launched the Citizens Public Safety Committee which is tasked with fostering and maintaining effective interaction with law enforcement, fire services, emergency medical services and emergency preparedness. The Citizen's Public Safety Committee issued its first update on July 27, 2016 discussing the impact that voter-enacted funding has had on public safety services.

Voter-enacted funding not only enabled the City to hire additional sheriff's deputies, but also to stabilize Stanton's long-term finances while maintaining quality public safety services. Without the voter-enacted funding, the City would need to make cuts to public safety services, including removing the new deputies and officers.

As noted in the City's recently adopted budget, Stanton would need more than \$2 million in cuts to public safety and fire service. Loss of voter-enacted funding would result in a loss of police and fire personnel, which could increase Stanton's 9-1-1 response times.

These cuts would also limit the City's quality-of-life programs, including the Gang and Youth Violence Prevention programs and homelessness prevention programs. Funding for public safety services currently represents over 70% of the City's budget and maintaining rapid emergency response and police protection will remain a top priority for our City. SPECIAL MESSAGE FROM LAW ENFORCEMENT ON HOMELESSNESS



Orange County has seen an increase in the number of homeless on our streets over the last few years. Fortunately, voter-approved funding allows Stanton the ability to help individuals, veterans and families transition away from homelessness. Stanton has helped place approximately 120 homeless people into permanent housing in the last eight months alone, including children. Your local police officers work with residents, non-profits, and the homeless to ensure that our parks and public areas are safe and secure for everyone.

ORANGE COUNTY FIRE AUTHORITY

Stanton's Emergency Medical Responders



The American Heart Association says the brain starts to deteriorate four to six minutes after a person stops breathing, making quick 9-1-1 response times critical for life-saving emergency care. Who responds to strokes, heart attacks and other life-threatening emergencies? Stanton's OCFA firefighters and first-responders, of course. As the first ones to respond in a medical emergency, this means that our firefighters provide the critical care Stanton residents depend on.

But what many residents don't know is that fighting fires is only a small part of what our local firefighters do. Over 75% of all 9-1-1 calls answered by the Orange County Fire Authority are medical emergencies, including strokes and heart attacks. In 2015, the Orange County Firefighters average 9-1-1 response time in Stanton was 5 minutes and 6 seconds, which is in the top 20% countywide. Continuing to maintain rapid 9-1-1 emergency response is essential so that people suffering from heart attacks, strokes or other medical emergencies continue to receive the immediate, life-saving care they need.



Voter-enacted funding has allowed the City to maintain current levels of firefighters and prevent cuts, and the OC Fire Authority has informed the city that we are at the minimal levels of firefighter staffing needed for our community. As noted in the City's recently adopted budget, should voter-enacted funding be repealed, Stanton would need to make more than \$2 million in cuts to public safety and fire service, which would result in the loss of newly-hired police and could increase Stanton's 9-1-1 response times.

The City of Stanton is committed to ensuring rapid emergency response times for emergency medical and fire protection services to all of the City's neighborhoods. If you have any questions, please visit our website at www.ci.stanton.ca.us/

Exit Drills in the Home

During a fire, every second counts! Plan ahead, create and practice your home escape plan to make sure that you and your family get out of your home quickly when the smoke alarm sounds.



Plan Ahead: Draw a floor plan of your home showing all the doors and windows in every room. Find two ways out of every room. Select a meeting place in front of your home and at a safe distance.

Practice: Practice your escape plan monthly with every member of the family. Teach children to escape on their own. Get out and stay out, never go back inside.

If Trapped by a Fire: Call 911. Close doors between you and the fire. Seal all door cracks and vents where smoke can enter with wet towels, linens, or clothing.

Smoke Alarms: Install a working smoke alarm on every level and in every bedroom. Test smoke alarms monthly and replace them if 10 years old or not working.

CITY NET

City Net has established a multi-organization partnership to end homelessness in Stanton, aimed at creating solutions and using existing resources effectively. With the presence of City Net’s services since December 18, 2015, the following has been accomplished:



Activities

- Weekly street outreaches with Stanton Police Services and Code Enforcement Officers canvassing more than 50 locations in the city where homeless neighbors are living.
- Contacted 210 homeless neighbors in Stanton, with 116 engaged in case management and 44 exited from the streets and into housing.
- Meetings with City staff, civic and faith community organizations to craft a common agenda and strategies around ending homelessness in Stanton.

CITY NET’S GOALS

Housing Placements: Move homeless neighbors off the streets and into housing

Professional street outreach and case management: Mobilize teams of professional street outreach workers, case managers and trained volunteers to accompany City agencies and Stanton Police Services to reach out to every single homeless person in the City.

Systems Integration: Integrate all activities and data within the Orange County continuum of care, using the coordinated entry system and Homeless Management Information System to connect Stanton homeless neighbors to available county and federal resources.

Overall objective: Reduce community costs related to homelessness.



PARK RANGER PROGRAM

Park Rangers patrol and monitor Stanton facilities and neighborhoods. They enforce rules, resolve disputes, educate the public and contact Stanton deputies to report activity.

The use of Park Rangers allows OCSO deputies to handle priority calls for service. The incidents that the Park Rangers have addressed are evidence of the continuing need to protect the parks and streets of Stanton to ensure the safety and security of residents.

Voter Registration

Voter registration forms are available in the Stanton City Clerk’s Office located in City Hall or with a valid California driver’s license, you can visit registertovote.ca.gov to fill out the registration form online. If you do not have a California Driver’s License or CA Identification Card, you will need to print out your completed registration form and mail it to the Orange County Registrar of Voters (P.O. Box 15467 Santa Ana, CA 92735-9902).

Do I need to Re-Register?

You must re-register to vote if you have permanently moved to a different address, changed your name, or if you wish to change your political party affiliation. The deadline to re-register is Monday, October 24, 2016.

NEW DEVELOPMENTS IN THE CITY

In recent months, the City has received a number of applications for new development on Beach Boulevard, and a number of the projects have been approved. Check out the new developments coming soon that will help revitalize our Beach Boulevard corridor!



Starbucks at the corner of Beach Boulevard and Garden Grove

In June, the City approved construction of a new building on the corner of Beach Boulevard and Garden Grove Boulevard in the Neighborhood Wal-Mart Shopping Center. The main anchor tenant will be a new Starbucks. Construction is anticipated to begin soon.

New mixed-use project

In June, the City approved construction of a new mixed-use project on the vacant lot on the corner of Beach Boulevard and Catherine Avenue. The project includes commercial uses on the ground floor, and an assisted living facility on the upper floors. Construction on this project is anticipated in the first quarter of 2017.



New commercial building

In August, the City approved construction of a new medical office building on the vacant lot just north of the CVS Pharmacy at the corner of Beach Boulevard and Lampson Avenue. This property has been sitting vacant for over 15 years, and new construction is anticipated soon!



MORE PROJECTS TO COME

In addition to the approved projects discussed above, we are also working on more exciting projects!

Stanton Plaza

The vacant properties at the corner of Beach Boulevard and Orangewood Avenue are in the final stages of application processing for a new commercial development. The proposal includes over 8,000 square feet of retail uses, a quick serve restaurant and service uses. Public hearings on the project will be coming soon!



Village Center

The Village Center located at the gateway to our City on the corner of Beach Boulevard and Garden Grove Boulevard is finally moving forward with new development. The current property owner is in the final negotiation process for the sale of the property to a new developer that will be revitalizing the commercial portion on the southern part of the property. This time next year, we hope to be seeing new development, new stores and a revitalized center. Stay tuned for new developments.

Beach Boulevard and Cerritos Avenue

The City is currently processing a new development proposal for the southwest corner of Beach Boulevard and Cerritos Avenue. This development proposal would be for construction of a brand new Del Taco, which will help to revitalize this corner. Look for a hearing date before the Planning Commission in October!

Beach Boulevard and Main Street

The City is working with a developer for the potential development of the northeast corner of Beach Boulevard and Main Street. This new development would revitalize half of the city block, providing a new two-story commercial building, and refurbishing existing structures. This will be a great new development in the northern part of our City!

Overall, the City has over nine vacant or underutilized properties along Beach Boulevard that staff is working with developers to revitalize. This is an exciting time for the City of Stanton!

NEW ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT REBATE PROGRAMS

The City Council recently approved two new business assistance programs.

EXTERIOR/FACADE IMPROVEMENT REBATE PROGRAM

This program provides a rebate of \$5,000 for single storefront and \$10,000 for multi-tenant buildings to be used for exterior building improvements or security measures visible from primary streets and may be utilized to pay for security personnel to protect said improvements for up to one year.

LIVABLE BEACH BOULEVARD MOBILITY IMPLEMENTATION REBATE PROGRAM

A maximum amount of \$15,000 is available to each property or business located along Beach Boulevard for the construction of improvement items identified within the Livable Beach Boulevard Mobility Plan, including landscape improvements, public art installation and more.

WEATHERIZING YOUR HOME

Understanding the Problem

When air moves in and out of your home through cracks, crevices, and other openings that is called infiltration. You will want to find the source and eliminate it. Infiltration can occur in three different ways:

- Wind-driven infiltration occurs when wind blows in through cracks in your house, bringing cold air in and forcing warm air out.
- The chimney effect occurs when warm air rises, escaping through cracks, and drawing cold air in at a lower level to replace it.
- Negative air pressure infiltration occurs when fuel-burning appliances decrease air pressure in your home, drawing in air to equalize the air pressure.

Developing Your Strategy

Visually inspect exterior walls for cracks and gaps. Examine areas where pipes or vents exit through the walls. Use your tape measure to determine the width of larger openings and make sketches if necessary. An average house will cost about \$50 to \$75 to weatherize. With notes from your home inspection in hand, you’re ready to develop a strategy to eliminate air infiltration, and cut your energy use.

BUILDING PERMITS

Whether replacing a window, or remodeling your kitchen, virtually every homeowner at some point wants to make changes to their home. A building permit is required for most construction projects. In addition to promoting quality construction and safety standards, the building permit process promotes projects that are attractive, fit well within a neighborhood and support good property values. The process to obtain a building permit follows several basic steps.



1. Draw a site plan

Don't forget to discuss your project with the Planning Division.



2. Call to confirm

that you need a building permit at (714) 890-4286.



3. Bring documents

Once Planning approves your documents, visit the Building Division from 7-8 a.m. and 1-5 p.m. Monday-Thursday.



4. Begin building

Once your plans are reviewed and marked code compliant, we'll issue a building permit.

We do our best to make the process quick and simple. Working without a building permit when one is required is illegal and can pose serious complications for your fire and homeowner's insurance when you try to sell your home.

HOLIDAY LIGHT REMOVAL

With the Holidays rapidly approaching, the tradition of decorating the exterior of your home with festive lights or other ornamentation may be on your list of preparatory tasks. The City of Stanton would like to remind you that, according to California Building Code, any temporary electrical fixtures on the exterior of your home should be removed within 90 days.

As such, all holiday decorative lighting or decorations that require electrical power need to be removed and stored no later than April 1, 2017.

STANTON CENTRAL PARK


On June 25, 2016 the construction of Stanton Central Park was substantially completed. Since then staff has been monitoring the maintenance and operations of the park, to refine the design and better fit the community’s needs. In order to accommodate for the frequent use of the splash pad area, benches and picnic tables have been relocated within the vicinity. Also, to keep cool during the summer season these picnic tables have had cantilever umbrellas installed to provide shade over them.

Due to the high volume of park users, additional picnic tables have been ordered and will be installed soon. Another addition to Stanton Central Park is vending machines, which will contain affordable healthy snacks and water. The machines are conveniently located next to the community center to provide easy access for skate park users, playground visitors and other guests.

The construction of Stanton Central Park was funded by former Redevelopment Act bonds, Prop 84 Grant and Park in Lieu and will not have any impact on the General Fund. The cost of the operations including maintenance and utilities of the park is funded by public-private partnerships.

FREE TREE PLANTING PROGRAM

Trying to improve the curb appeal in front of your home? The purpose of the City’s Tree Planting Program is to promote the planting of trees within our City. There are many benefits to increasing urban forestry within the City of Stanton and you can take advantage of this free program. Upon request by a property or business owner, the City will plant a tree next to the property within the parkway (the area between the curb and the sidewalk). The City will trim the tree and only asks the person requesting the tree to water it. Over fifty (50) new trees have been planted throughout the City since 2015. Kermore Lane Street Reconstruction

Kermore Lane from Knott Avenue to Keenan Place was annexed by the City in 2012. The street was not fully developed, so as a condition of annexation the County was required to pay for the reconstruction of the street to current standards. The City’s design consultant prepared plans for this work, but the construction was put on hold due to the development of 41 new homes on the street. As these homes were recently completed, the project was put out to bid and a construction contract was awarded to Excel Paving to complete the work.

Currently utilities are being relocated and the bulk of the work is yet to come. Staff is currently working with Excel Paving project managers and has held a preconstruction meeting. Construction is expected to begin in September. Staff will hold a meeting with the residents prior to the start of construction. Please note that there will be absolutely no vehicular access to the street for 24 hours when the existing street is crushed and cement is added to it.

New City of Stanton Organics Recycling Program

To achieve diverting 75% of solid waste away from the landfill and complying with State regulations (AB 1594), the City of Stanton is launching an organics recycling program. Your yard waste and kitchen scraps will be collected and transported to CR&R Environmental Service’s Anaerobic Digester (AD). The AD will convert kitchen scraps and yard waste into renewable natural gas and fertilizer. This exciting program will help keep Stanton’s organics waste out of the landfill and will produce a renewable zero waste carbon bio-fuel.



How the organic cart will work:

- Residents will separate their kitchen scraps and yard waste in your new organics container.
- Your current service day will not change.
- Carts should be placed at curbside or designated collection point no later than 6:30 a.m. with the handles and wheels facing towards your home.
- Please place carts side-by-side approximately 1-foot apart and at least 3 feet from any obstruction (i.e. parked cars, trees, mailboxes, etc.)

Graffiti Hotline/Report

Public Works crews are responsible for the elimination of graffiti from parks, sidewalks, and public buildings within the City. Abatement techniques include cleaning and painting over graffiti. The Public Works Department will only abate graffiti on public property and on areas in the line of sight from major arterial streets. EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

September is National Preparedness Month



The City is urging residents to make a commitment to be prepared for emergencies. Following a disaster, there will be an overwhelming demand to reach people in distress.

Therefore, it's essential to plan ahead and have basic necessities on hand like an emergency kit that can sustain you and your family for 72 hours until first responders can arrive.

Your emergency kit should include:

- Water, one gallon per person and pet per day for at least three days, for drinking and sanitation
- Food, at least a three-day supply of non-perishable food
- Battery-powered or hand-crank radio
- Flashlight
- Extra batteries
- First aid kit
- Whistle to signal for help
- Dust mask to help filter contaminated air and plastic sheeting and duct tape to shelter-in-place
- Moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties for personal sanitation
- Wrench or pliers to turn off utilities
- Manual can opener for food
- Local Maps
- Cell phone with chargers, inverter or solar charger
- Important family documents

Alert OC and Yearly Test Date

Residents can do their part to prepare for emergencies by registering for Alert OC at www.AlertOC.com with their cell phone numbers and email addresses to receive future emergency alerts. Alert OC has the ability to register more than one contact method at a specific address. Registrations of cell phone and alternate numbers increase the ability to reach the greatest number of people within minutes. This enables landlines, cell phones and email addresses to be incorporated into a single notification system.

The City of Stanton will participate in the Alert OC Regional Test Exercise on Thursday, October 20, 2016.

The Great California Shakeout

The City of Stanton will be participating in the “Great California Shakeout”, a statewide earthquake drill on October 20, 2016. Due to the potential of a large-scale earthquake hitting California in the future, scientists from the U.S. Geological governments have organized this event as a way to raise awareness within communities and encourage families and businesses to prepare a plan in case an emergency occurs.

The earthquake drill itself will occur at 10:20 a.m. on Thursday, October 20 when millions of Californians will “Drop, Cover, and Hold on.” The City encourages everyone to take part as a family, business, organization, or on an individual basis.

PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIPS WORKING AT STANTON CENTRAL PARK



Historically, the Stanton City Council has always placed a high priority on parks, recreation and open space elements in our community. This is evident as the City Council adopted the Recreation Master Plan in 2005 and the City's General Plan in 2008. These documents provide guidelines and strategies to improve the community's growing park needs.

Stanton currently has a park ratio of only .94 acres per 1,000 residents, which is well below the state standard of 3 acres per 1,000 residents. City Council is determined to move toward this standard through a variety of methods.

Stanton Central Park was funded purely through the procurement of a State Prop 84 grant, restricted bonds and park-in-lieu funds restricted for building new parks.

The City has successfully created a Public-Private Partnership Model specifically related to the on-going maintenance and utility payments for Stanton Central Park.

Stanton City Manager, James A. Box expresses, "Finding a way to fund these on-going expenses has been a top priority for the last year. I am proud to say that we were successful in securing over \$100,000 for the annual maintenance and utility costs of Stanton Central Park, by thinking outside the box."

With support from our local partners, we have enhanced our Public-Private Partnerships to create a true model of sustainability.


