CITY MANAGER'S MESSAGE

The City of Stanton is Working for You

As we head into summer and the days grow longer, I encourage Stanton residents to use those additional hours of daylight to spend more time in our local parks, try a new recreation class, or simply enjoy your neighborhood.

I continue to enjoy my own visits to Stanton's neighborhoods through the City's "Talk on the Block" neighborhood meetings. Accompanied by representatives from OC Sheriff's and Fire Authority, all City departments, and members of the City Council, we take city hall to you. By listening to your needs, getting your feedback, and answering your questions, we work to ensure city services are addressing the needs of every Stanton neighborhood.

To learn more about how the City is working for you, read through this issue of the *Community News and Activities Guide*. Meet Stanton's new Police Chief, find the latest statistics on police and firefighter calls for service, learn about new economic development initiatives, and get excited about the opening of Stanton Central Park (funded completely through non-general fund monies, including bonds, park-in-lieu funds, along with generous sponsorships from local businesses!). With support from our local partners, we have enhanced our public and private partnerships to create a true model of sustainability moving forward. Everyone is invited to join the park's opening day festivities on June 25, 2016, at 2 p.m.

The City is also in the midst of our annual budget process, and the City Council will approve a balanced budget in June. This process considers the City's current financial picture as well as the outlook for long-term financial sustainability. We continue to receive questions about the initiative measure on the November ballot that would cut approximately \$3.2 million annually from the City budget by terminating the one-cent sales tax funding.

This loss of funding does not impact the current budget, but the City would face substantial reductions to services in the next budget cycle. To learn more about the budget, please visit the City's website: www.ci.stanton.ca.us.

La Ciudad de Stanton está trabajando para usted

A medida que nos acercamos al verano y los días se hacen más largos, animo a los residentes de Stanton a utilizar esas horas adicionales de luz del día para pasar más tiempo en nuestros parques locales, intentar una nueva clase de recreación, o simplemente disfrutar de su vecindario.

Sigo disfrutando de mis propias visitas a los vecindarios de Stanton a través de reuniones de vecinos en la ciudad, "Talk on the Block". Acompañado por representantes de policía, bomberos, todos los departamentos de la ciudad, y los miembros del Ayuntamiento, le llevamos los asuntos de la ciudad a usted. Al identificar sus necesidades, obteniendo sus comentarios, y respondiendo a sus preguntas, trabajamos para garantizar que los servicios de la ciudad están atendiendo las necesidades de cada vecindario de Stanton.

Para aprender más acerca de cómo la Ciudad está trabajando para usted, lea a través de esta edición del folleto Community News and Activities Guide. Conozca al nuevo jefe de Policía de Stanton, consulte las últimas estadísticas de llamadas para servicio de la policía y de bomberos, aprenda acerca de las nuevas iniciativas de desarrollo económico, y entusiásmese con la apertura de Stanton Central Park (financiado completamente a través de los fondos de dinero no generales, incluyendo bonos, fondos park-in-lieu, además de generosos patrocinios de empresas locales!). Todos están invitados a unirse a las festividades del día de apertura del parque el 25 de junio de 2016.

La ciudad también está en medio del proceso de presupuesto anual, y el Ayuntamiento aprobará un presupuesto equilibrado en junio. Este proceso considera la situación financiera actual de la ciudad, así como las perspectivas para la sostenibilidad financiera a largo plazo. Seguimos recibiendo preguntas sobre la medida de iniciativa en la papeleta de noviembre que recortaría aproximadamente \$ 3.2 millones de dólares anuales al presupuesto de la ciudad terminando la financiación de impuesto de ventas de un centavo.

Esta pérdida de fondos no afectará el presupuesto actual, pero la ciudad enfrentaría reducciones sustanciales a los servicios en el próximo ciclo presupuestario. Para obtener más información sobre el presupuesto, por favor visite el sitio web de la Ciudad: www.ci.stanton.ca.us.

Thành phố Stanton đang làm việc cho bạn

Như chúng ta đi vào mùa hè và những ngày dài hơn, tôi khuyến khích cư dân Stanton để sử dụng những giờ thêm ánh sáng ban ngày để dành nhiều thời gian trong công viên địa phương của chúng tôi, hãy thử một lớp học giải trí mới, hoặc chỉ đơn giản là an hưởng khu phố của bạn.

Tôi tiếp tục được hưởng những lần thăm của tôi đến khu phố Stanton qua "Talk on the Block" của Thành phố họp khu phố. Cùng với đại diện từ cảnh sát Quận Cam và ban chữa cháy, tất cả các phòng ban thành phố, và các thành viên của Hội đồng thành phố, chúng tôi đem hội trường thành phố đến cho bạn. Bằng cách lắng nghe nhu cầu của bạn, nhận được thông tin phản hồi của bạn, và trả lời câu hỏi của bạn, chúng tôi làm việc để đảm bảo dịch vụ thành phố đang giải quyết các nhu cầu của mỗi khu phố Stanton.

Để tìm hiểu thêm về cách thành phố đang làm việc cho bạn, xin mời đọc qua vấn đề này trong tin cộng đồng và các hoạt động hướng dẫn mới, gặp cảnh sát trưởng Stanton, tìm số liệu thống kê mới nhất về cảnh sát và các cuộc gọi linh cứu hỏa cho dịch vụ, tìm hiểu về các sáng kiến phát triển kinh tế mới, và được vui mừng về việc mở Stanton Central Park (được tài trợ hoàn toàn thông qua các khoản tiền quỹ không lấy từ quỹ chung của thành phố, bao gồm cả trái phiếu, quỹ đỗ xe, cùng với tài trợ hào phóng từ các doanh nghiệp địa phương!). Mọi người đều được mời tham gia lễ hội trong ngày khai mạc của công viên vào ngày 25 tháng 6 năm 2016.

Thành phố cũng đang trong giai đoạn của quá trình ngân sách hàng năm của chúng tôi, và Hội đồng thành phố sẽ phê chuẩn một ngân sách cân bằng trong tháng Sáu. Quá trình này xem xét bức tranh tài chính hiện hành của thành phố cũng như triển vọng cho sự bền vững tài chính dài hạn. Chúng tôi tiếp tục nhận được những câu hỏi về các biện pháp chủ động trên là phiếu tháng mười một sẽ cắt giảm khoảng \$3,2 triệu hàng năm từ ngân sách thành phố bằng cách chấm dứt kinh phí thuế doanh thu một xu.

Sự mất mát này vốn không ảnh hưởng đến ngân sách hiện tại, nhưng thành phố sẽ phải đối mặt với cắt giảm đáng kể các dịch vụ trong chu kỳ ngân sách tiếp theo. Để tìm hiểu thêm về ngân sách, vui lòng truy cập trang web của Thành phố: www.ci.stanton.ca.us.

Update on Stanton's Public Safety



Over the past year, the City of Stanton has made it a priority to maintain and improve local public safety services. Due to voter-enacted funding, the City has been able to add two sheriff's deputies to the force protecting Stanton, among other safety improvements.

We are now excited to introduce the newest addition to our public safety team, Stanton's new Chief of Police, Lieutenant Sean Howell. Lieutenant Howell has been a member of the Orange County Sheriff's Department for over twenty-one years, including eight years directly serving the citizens of Stanton and neighboring unincorporated areas. We look forward to having him direct the efforts of our police force to keep Stanton safe – particularly as public safety calls for service have grown.

The responsibilities of Stanton's police force have continued to increase. In the past year, our sheriffs have received 19,517 calls for service, an increase of 18% over 2014. That's an average of 53 calls each day.

Stanton sheriffs average three arrests per day, with a total of 143 gang arrests – a 10% increase over 2014. With 11 active gangs currently operating in the City that have a combined total of approximately 600 gang members, our sheriffs are committed to providing rapid 9-1-1 response and gang and youth violence prevention and intervention programs.

To further strengthen the City's commitment to safety, this year Stanton has launched a Citizens Public Safety Committee which is tasked with fostering and maintaining effective interaction with law enforcement, fire services, emergency medical services and emergency preparedness. Over recent months, the committee has been briefed by Orange County Sheriffs and Fire Authority and will be reporting back to the Council and community on emergency response and other safety issues.

Funding for public safety services currently represents over 70% of the City's budget and maintaining rapid emergency response and police protection will remain a top priority for our City. ORANGE COUNTY FIRE AUTHORITY Stanton's Emergency Medical Responders



Who responds to a 9-1-1 fire in your home or business? Your friendly neighborhood firefighters, of course. For Stanton, that means firefighters from the Orange County Fire Authority.

But what many residents don't know is that fighting fires is only a small part of what our local firefighters do. Over 75% of all 9-1-1 calls answered by the Orange County Fire Authority are medical emergencies. In 2014, they responded to 88,168 calls for emergency medical services compared to 1,979 fires – out of a total of 117,100 incidents.

In 2015, there were even more demands on Orange County Firefighters with the number of incidents they responded to increasing by 23%!

When responding to an emergency, seconds count. The American Heart Association says the brain starts to deteriorate four to six minutes after a person stops breathing. As the first ones to respond in a medical emergency, this means that our firefighters provide the critical care Stanton residents depend on.

In 2015, the OC Firefighters average 9-1-1 response time in Stanton was 5 minutes and 6 seconds, which is in the top 20% countywide. Continuing to maintain rapid 9-1-1 emergency response is essential so that people suffering from heart attacks, strokes or other medical emergencies continue to receive the immediate, life-saving care they need.

Voter-enacted funding has allowed the City to maintain current levels of firefighters and prevent cuts, and the OC Fire Authority has informed the city that we are at the minimal levels of firefighter staffing needed for our community. The City of Stanton is committed to ensuring rapid emergency response times for emergency medical and fire protection services to all of the City's neighborhoods.

ABC'S OF WATER SAFETY

Prevent Drowning Never Swim Alone



Children and adults drown without a sound. Drowning is the leading cause of accidental death for children under the age of five and can happen in less than two inches of water.

A is for Active Adult Supervision

- Keep infants and toddlers within an arm's reach when near water.
- Never swim alone, even adults.
- Never rely on water wings, rafts, or other swimming aids in place of U.S. Coast Guard-approved personal flotation devices (life jackets).
- If a child or adult is missing, every second counts. Check the water FIRST!

B is for Barriers

- Install and maintain proper fencing around the pool and spa to isolate swimming areas from the home and play areas.
- Use multiple layers of protection, such as fences, gate/door alarms, and safety covers, to keep children away from pools and spas.
- Use self-closing, self-latching gates that open outward, away from the pool.
- Remove items such as chairs or tables that a child could use to climb over a fence.

C is for Classes

- Learn to swim. Do not rely on swimming aids such as water wings, rafts, or noodles.
- Learn first aid and CPR. Always keep a phone nearby to call 9-1-1.
- Teach children that running, jumping, and pushing others on pool decks is dangerous and can cause injuries.

COMBATING HOMELESSNESS WITH CITY NET

City Net has established a multi-organization partnership to end homelessness in Stanton, aimed at creating solutions and using existing resources effectively. With the presence of City Net’s services since December 18, 2015, the following has been accomplished:

City Net’s Objective: Reduce community costs related to homelessness.

Activities

- Accompaniments with Stanton Police and Code Enforcement Officers canvassing neighborhoods.
- Secure donations for Stanton First Responders in order to provide direct services 24/7.
- 15 individuals moved off the streets through the collaborative working together!
- Stanton Homeless Collaborative Meeting-Every 4th Wednesday 2:30-4 p.m. at City Hall.

City Net’s Goals

Housing placements: Move homeless neighbors off the streets and on the path to housing.

Professional outreach: Mobilize teams of professional outreach workers, case managers and trained volunteers to conduct twice-weekly street outreaches to homeless neighbors with the Police Services Department and other City agencies.

Data coordination: Coordinate data within the Homeless Management Information System and share information with collaborative partners.

Upcoming Event: Christmas in July

In the month of July, volunteers are needed to plan a city-wide resource drive to stock much needed items like water, food gift cards, gas cards, bus passes, etc. for effective professional weekly outreach. If interested, please contact Terri Larson at (909) 539-3753 or at tlarson@citynet.org.



NEIGHBORHOOD ENHANCEMENT TASK FORCE

PARK RANGER PROGRAM

Park Rangers patrol and monitor Stanton facilities and neighborhoods. They enforce rules, resolve disputes, educate the public and contact Stanton deputies to report activity.

The use of Park Rangers allows Orange County Sherrif’s Department deputies to handle priority calls for service. The incidents that the Park Rangers have addressed are evidence of the continuing need to protect the parks and streets of Stanton to ensure the safety and security of residents.

TRANSPARENCY IN GOVERNMENT

OpenGov Tool Now Available

The City of Stanton is proud of the commitment to ensure fiscal transparency. Stanton has partnered with OpenGov to provide a transparent view of how your tax dollars are spent through every aspect of our outstanding services. OpenGov provides a one-stop shop for any financial data and showcases various graphs and analysis of our present and past budget.



The powerful online tool transforms complex financial data into an interactive, digital format that allows better understanding of the city’s finances. The user-friendly design makes it easier to explore how taxpayer money is collected and used. The platform may be accessed at www.ci.stanton.ca.us/opengov.

The OpenGov platform displays financial data from 2007 to the current budget of city spending and revenue in a user-friendly portal. Users can view historical revenue and expenditure trends over time and explore multiple views of financial data, including by fund, department, expense, or revenue type.

For example, visitors to the platform may answer frequently asked questions such as, “How is Stanton Central Park being funded,” then find that this project was completely funded by former Redevelopment Act bonds, the Prop 84 Grant, Park in Lieu funds, and generous sponsors.

Beyond sharing information with the public, the City of Stanton can also use OpenGov internally to create custom reports, manage operations to budget, and keep administrators informed. With the launch, Stanton joins a growing list of leading cities, counties, state agencies, school systems, and special districts across the country that leverage OpenGov technology.

Public Safety Committee

The Public Safety Committee has been created to serve as a liaison between the public and the City Council on matters related to public safety services. Members foster and maintain effective interaction with law enforcement, fire services, emergency medical services and emergency preparedness. The committee also supports and promotes crime-prevention awareness throughout the community through programs such as Neighborhood Watch. The Committee advises the City Council on these and other safety issues.

NEW ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT REBATE PROGRAMS

The City Council recently approved two new business assistance programs.

EXTERIOR/FACADE IMPROVEMENT REBATE PROGRAM

This program provides a rebate of \$5,000 for single storefront and \$10,000 for multi-tenant buildings to be used for exterior building improvements or security measures visible from primary streets and may be utilized to pay for security personnel to protect said improvements for up to one year.

LIVABLE BEACH BOULEVARD MOBILITY IMPLEMENTATION REBATE PROGRAM

A maximum amount of \$15,000 is available to each property or business located along Beach Boulevard for the construction of improvement items identified within the Livable Beach Boulevard Mobility Plan, including landscape improvements, public art installation, and more.

FIREWORKS

To prevent property loss, and ensure the safety of your family, your home, and your business, the City of Stanton has scheduled additional law enforcement and fire protection personnel for the night of July 4th. Please enjoy this holiday but observe the following safety rules:

- No block parties on city streets, sidewalks or public right-of-ways.
- City Parks will close at 7:30 p.m.
- Fireworks may only be discharged on private residential property.
- No person under the age of 18 years shall purchase ANY fireworks, including safe and sane.
- Any person found in violation of these provisions may be issued an administrative citation by an enforcement officer and subject to a \$1,000 fine for each violation.
- DO NOT DISCHARGE FIREWORKS ON ANY PUBLIC RIGHT-OF-WAY, CITY STREET, SIDEWALK, CITY PARK, OR PRIVATE, COMMERCIAL OR INDUSTRIAL PROPERTY.

BUILDING PERMITS

Whether replacing a window, or remodeling your kitchen, virtually every homeowner at some point wants to make changes to their home. A building permit is required for most construction projects. In addition to promoting quality construction and safety standards, the building permit process promotes projects that are attractive, fit well within a neighborhood and support good property values. The process to obtain a building permit follows several basic steps.



1. Draw a site plan

Don't forget to discuss your project with the Planning Division.



2. Call to confirm

that you need a building permit at (714) 890-4286.



3. Bring documents

Once Planning approves your documents, visit the Building Division from 7-8 a.m. and 1-5 p.m. Monday-Thursday.



4. Begin building

Once your plans are reviewed and marked code compliant, we'll issue a building permit.

We do our best to make the process quick and simple. Working without a building permit when one is required is illegal and can pose serious complications for your fire and homeowner's insurance when you try to sell your home.

GARAGE SALE PERMITS

Just a friendly summer reminder, if you plan on cleaning out that garage this year with the intention of selling your unwanted items for extra cash, please be aware that permits are required for Garage Sales within the City of Stanton. The cost of the permit is \$10 and is to be obtained prior to the date of the garage sale. Proof of residency at the address listed on the application will be requested when you apply for the permit at City Hall, during our regular office hours of Monday-Thursday, from 7 a.m. – 12 p.m. & 1 – 6 p.m.


BEACH BOULEVARD BEAUTIFICATION

The Beach Boulevard Beautification Project is scheduled to be completed in the summer of 2016. The proposed improvements- which include new monument signs at the main City entrances, street names signs at major streets and landscape improvements along Beach Boulevard medians will create a more pleasant atmosphere for residents and visitors that will better represent the community. With the drought California has been facing, there are added water conservation goals and regulations implemented by public agencies. The new plant materials are classified as “low water use”. This project is funded by the Lighting/Median Maintenance fund and will not have any impact on the General Fund.

FREE TREE PLANTING PROGRAM

Upon request by a property or business owner, the City will plant a tree next to their property within the parkway. Over 50 new trees have been planted throughout the City in 2015. Please visit www.ci.stanton.ca.us or contact Public Works at (714) 890-4205 if you’re interested in making your property greener!

The City is responsible for the planting and trimming of trees planted within the parkway. However, per the City’s Municipal Code, it is the responsibility of the owner or person in possession of a property next to the parkway to maintain, water, and keep the area clean, including mowing and trimming of grass and vegetation.

Kermore Lane Street Reconstruction

In June 2012, the Kermore Island was officially annexed to the City of Stanton. As a result of the annexation, the County of Orange provided the City with funds to construct street improvements on Kermore Lane from Knott Ave to Lowden Street. Due to heavy construction within private property along Kermore Lane in the past couple of years, construction of this project was rescheduled to the spring/summer of 2016. The Kermore Lane community is very excited about the proposed modifications as the image and function of the street will improve significantly.

New City of Stanton Organics Recycling Program

To achieve diverting 75% of solid waste away from the landfill and complying with State regulations (AB 1594), the City of Stanton is launching an organics recycling program. Your yard waste and kitchen scraps will be collected and transported to CR&R Environmental Service's Anaerobic Digester (AD). The AD will convert kitchen scraps and yard waste into renewable natural gas and fertilizer. This exciting program will help keep Stanton's organics waste out of the landfill and will produce a renewable zero waste carbon bio-fuel.



How the organic cart will work:

- Residents will separate their kitchen scraps and yard waste in your new organics container.
- Your current service day will not change.
- Carts should be placed at curbside or designated collection point no later than 6:30 a.m. with the handles and wheels facing towards your home.
- Please place carts side-by-side approximately 1-foot apart and at least 3 feet from any obstruction (i.e. parked cars, trees, mailboxes, etc.)

Commercial Recycling

The State of California passed AB 341 that enacts a statewide mandate for business recycling. The primary purpose of AB 341 is to reduce greenhouse gas emissions by diverting business waste through greater recycling efforts. AB 341 requires all businesses in California that generate 4 or more cubic yards of waste per week and multi-family units with 5 units or more recycle.

Water Conservation

California is currently experiencing one of the worst droughts in years. Governor Brown has declared a drought emergency and has mandated a reduction in Stanton of 16% of water usage. In our businesses and homes, using water more efficiently will lessen the effects of the limited water supply. F.O.G. Container Program

The City of Stanton is working with CR&R and the Orange County Sanitation District to operate a Fats, Oils, and Grease (F.O.G.) recycling program in Stanton.

PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIPS WORKING AT STANTON CENTRAL PARK

Historically, the Stanton City Council has always placed a high priority on parks, recreation and open space elements in our community. This is evident as the City Council adopted the Recreation Master Plan in 2005 and the City’s General Plan in 2008. These documents provide guidelines and strategies to improve the community’s growing park needs.

Stanton currently has a park ratio of only .94 acres per 1,000 residents, which is well below the state standard of 3 acres per 1,000 residents. City Council is determined to move toward this standard through a variety of methods.

Stanton Central Park was funded purely through the procurement of a State Prop 84 grant, restricted bonds and park-in-lieu funds restricted for building new parks.

The City has successfully created a Public-Private Partnership Model specifically related to the on-going maintenance and utility payments for Stanton Central Park.

Stanton City Manager, James A. Box expresses, “Finding a way to fund these on-going expenses has been a top priority for the last year. I am proud to say that we were successful in securing over \$100,000 for the annual maintenance and utility costs of Stanton Central Park, by thinking outside the box.”

With support from our local partners, we have enhanced our Public-Private Partnerships to create a true model of sustainability.







For qualified low and middle income home owners and renters VICS will assist each client with a home assessment of what energy measures will be installed, help the homeowner fill out the paperwork and then make an appointment to dispatch a weatherization crew to install the home energy savings measures.

In addition, qualified applicants can receive a new refrigerator if their current unit was purchased prior to 1998. VICS will install a new refrigerator and haul away the old one. If you feel you qualify for VICS services as a low to middle income renter or homeowner call 1-888-958-8304. VICS will follow through and make the arrangements to weatherize your home or apartment.




