Assembly Bill 341 directed CalRecycle to enforce regulations for **mandatory commercial recycling** in order to **reduce greenhouse gas** by diverting commercial waste & to **expand the opportunity** for additional recycling services and recycling manufacturing facilities in California.

Benefits of Commercial Recycling

- Increase the availability of recyclable materials
- **Expand the opportunity for additional recycling & manufacturing facilities & jobs**
- Create cost savings by increasing recycling and reducing disposal
- **Create healthy environment for our community**

Regulatory Requirements

Businesses that dispose of **4 cubic yards/week** of solid waste per week and multifamily units of **5 or more units** are required to recycle.





The City of Stanton has an exclusive agreement with **CR&R Environmental Services** to provide waste removal and recycling services in the City. The solid waste that is collected is processed at a **Mixed Waste Materials Recovery Facility.**

How Does it Work

TEMPORARY SERVICE

Larger waste collection containers [from 3 yards to 40 yards] are available for clean-up projects and other disposal needs.



Step 1: Place waste in the dumpster. To increase recycling and diversion, bag wet waste separately and place in bin.

How Does it Work

Step 2: Waste is taken to the MRF where recyclables are separated by a combination of manual and mechanical sorting.



Hazardous Waste

Hazardous Waste are products that are flammable, corrosive, or toxic, and are *illegal* to dispose of in your containers. For a list of companies that accept business hazardous waste, visit

Items that can't fit in your bins require special pick up. **E-waste** (e.g. T.V.) and **white goods** (e.g. refrigerators) **cannot be dispose in your bin.** CR&R will collect these goods and dispose of them properly. For information, please call **714-826-9049.**
