

What You Need to Know About the Commercial Recycling Regulation Requirements

Assembly Bill 341 directed CalRecycle to develop and adopt regulations for mandatory commercial recycling. The Mandatory Commercial Recycling Regulations was adopted by CalRecycle on January 17, 2012 and implemented on July 1, 2012.



Purpose: To reduce greenhouse gas emissions by diverting commercial waste to recycling efforts and to expand the opportunity for additional recycling services and recycling manufacturing facilities in California.

Benefits of Commercial Recycling

- Increase the availability of recyclable materials
- Provide increased feedstock for recycled-content products manufactures
- Expand the opportunity for additional recycling and manufacturing facilities and jobs
- Create cost savings by increasing recycling and reducing disposal
- Create healthy environment for our community and future generations.

Regulatory Requirements

Businesses that dispose of 4 cy/week of solid waste and multifamily units of 5 or more are required to recycle using any combination of the following:

- Using the franchise hauler,
- Arranging for pick-up, and/or
- Self-hauling.





The City of Stanton has an exclusive agreement with **CR&R Environmental Services** to provide waste removal and recycling services in the City of Stanton. Solid waste collected in the City of Stanton is processed at a **Mixed Waste Materials Recovery Facility(MRF)**.

How Does it Work

TEMPORARY SERVICE

Larger waste collection containers [from 3 yards to 40 yards] are available for clean-up projects and other disposal needs.



Step 1: Place waste in the dumpster. To increase recycling and diversion, bag wet waste separately and place in bin.

How Does it Work

Step 2: Waste is taken to the MRF where recyclables are separated by a combination of manual and mechanical sorting. Recyclables are separated and shipped to recycling markets and residue waste is sent to a disposal facility





Items that cannot fit in your bins are considered bulky items and require special pick up. For more information please call 714-826-9049.
