

A Safer Scene for Stanton Students

As school bells ring to begin the new school year, Stanton-area schools will now receive city-funded crossing guard services. After four years of being unable to pay for crossing guards due to budget cuts, the voter-approved Measure GG funds now provide the ability for the City to sponsor these important safety services for its children. Hansen Elementary School in the Savanna School District is one of the Stanton-area schools receiving the City-funded crossing guards.

Savanna School District Superintendent, Dr. Sue Johnson highlighted, "The safety of our children is of paramount importance to us. We're especially grateful to the residents of Stanton for their support of Measure GG that has allowed the City of Stanton to continue to provide this essential service for our children." With the funding of crossing guards, the schools can allocate more funds to the classroom.

In the November 2014 election, Stanton voters strongly approved Measure GG, a one-cent local sales tax which provides funding to maintain local city services. Measure GG is anticipated to bring Stanton over \$3 million in annual revenues, which enables the addition of two sheriff deputies, one code enforcement officer, funding for school crossing guards and added resources for economic development programs.
